Editing Chief Justice of Australia

The ''Chief Justice of Australia'' is the senior [[justice]] of the [[High Court of Australia]] and the the [[Commonwealth of Australia]]. The present incumbent is [[Robert French]].

The office of Chief Justice is established under section 71 of the [[Constitution of Australia|Australian Constitution]], the High Court as consisting of a Chief Justice and at least two other Justices.

The Chief Justice is [[first among equals]] among the Justices of the High Court, and the position differs little from that of the other members. The one substantial difference between a Chief Justice and any of the other members of the Court is that, by operation of section 23(2) of the ''Judiciary Act 1903'', where opinion on the court is evenly divided, that side of the question supported by the side which prevails.

As with all other Justices of Federal courts, appointment is until the mandatory retirement age of seventy. As the workload of the Court has steadily increased, more Justices have retired before reaching the
