Rose, a switch hitter all-time Major League leader in hits (4,256), games played (3,562), at-bats (14,053)^[1], and outs (10,328). He won three World Series rings, three batting titles, one Mo... Valuable Player Award, two Gold Gloves, the Rookie of the Year Award, and made 17 All-Star appearances at an unequalled five different positions (2B, LF, RF, 3B, an... Rose's nickname, "Charlie Hustle", was given to him for his unique playing style. Even when being walked, Rose would sprint to first base, instead of the traditional trot
